

**CITY OF GLENDALE
ORDINANCE 01-2014**

**AMENDING ORDINANCE 90.03 SECTION (B) ALLOWING CHICKENS WITHIN CITY LIMITS
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the City of Glendale finds it in the public interest to update and revise Ordinance 90.03, Section B, Farm Animals, regulating and allowing chickens within the City and for protection of the Public Health, Safety and Welfare.


WHEREAS, it has been established that the following guidelines will be followed and enforced:

1. Restricted to chickens only, no other fowl
2. No roosters
3. 10 total wing clipped hens
4. Chickens will be confined to the owner(s) property
5. Chickens are not allowed on the City right-of-ways
6. Any person(s) in charge of a real property that keeps chickens is responsible for keeping chickens on the property.
7. No chicken coop, nesting box will be outside the Glendale Zoning and Land Development set backs.
8. Pens smaller than 15' x 15' will not be within 10' of a property line
9. If the entire yard is open to ranging chicken, chickens may range within set back
10. Material from nesting box or coop cleaning, will immediately be tilled into the ground or placed in a sealed container and disposed of
11. Chicken feed; only enough for daily use will be left out. All other feed will be stored in a sealable metal container.
12. If there are three confirmed incidents of chickens at large, for any one real property, for any reason, the person(s) in charge of said real property will forfeit the right to keep chickens for five (5) years.
13. All chicken broods will be registered with the City


SECTION 2. DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.
